IPLE's 21st International Seminar took place from October 5 to 9, 2009, in Hilversum (Netherlands).

There were 50 participants from 7 different European countries: from Bulgaria, Germany, Estonia, Finland, Greece, Holland and Portugal.

The seminar was organized in cooperation with the Regional Opleidingen Centrum (ROC van Amsterdam). In the spring ROC van Amsterdam started a new project of *Productive Learning in the* Netherlands with 30 students. The participants of the seminar had the opportunity to visit the project in Keerkelanden.

The seminar focused on the question "How to get back young people to learning?" Referring to this question, participants exchanged and created new ideas on ways Productive Learning in different countries supports young people who left school too early, by developing learning motivation and a different attitude towards learning and challenges waiting in the future.
